New Business

CART 101 Course Outline

- The learning objectives were updated based on the new general education learning objectives
- Schuyler recommended less "signature assignments" for assessment reporting, and because adjuncts teach this course a lot
- Jennifer & Brian will update the outline for the next meeting

Health Sciences

- 4 courses are being updated to describe the courses better
 - Learning objectives have been updated
 - HLTH 341 & HLTH 342 are to be cross-listed with SOCL 341 & SOCL 342, which are new classes
 - The catalog description and prerequisites were updated on PED 421
 - Course rotations have been updated for multiple courses in department
 - There were small edits recommended to the outlines for EXSC 465 and HLTH/SOCL 341
- Updates to Plans of Study
 - The plans of study for the Athletic Conditioning & Coaching, Exercise Science, Wellness Management, and Health & PE majors were updated based on the course rotation and title changes
 - HLTH/SOCL course needs corrected on the Wellness Management major
 - In HPE major, Kevin asked about bolding the courses that must be taken in that semester so that students know what course they really need to take in order to stay on track for graduation
- Exercise Science Minor
 - BIOL 309 & 310 were discontinued last year, but were not replaced in this minor. These courses are being replaced with their new equivalent courses, HLTH 230 & 231
- Bachelor of Health Sciences
 - This is a new major for students who want to go to health related professional schools

- There are multiple areas of emphasis for students to choose which path/school they want to go into
- There have been issues with financial aid paying for the additional course requirements that schools require our students to take
- Kevin stated that the College of Health Sciences wants to build additional partnerships with other institutions for these programs
- Areas of Emphasis will show on the student's transcript. These have to be manually entered on transcripts by the Registrar's Office and will delay the end of the semester processes and transcript availability
