

## Glenville State University Associate Degree in General Studies Program Information

Students who wish to earn an Associate's Degree in General Studies by the time they graduate high school will need to begin taking courses in the fall of their junior year of high school.

Students will take either Dual Credit (high school and college credit) courses face-to-face at their high school or enroll in Dual Enrollment (college credit only) Online Courses.

Students will need to take **15** credit hours each semester, totaling **60** credit hours to complete the program.

*If a student wishes to take a lightened load of credit hours during a particular semester, summer course options are available that can be taken to stay on track.*

*As a requirement for an Associate's Degree, students will need to choose an area of interest in which they will take **12** credit hours out of the **60** required.*

*AP Credits and Transfer Credits can also be accepted for program completion.*

**Current available areas of interest are as follows:** *Business, Criminal Justice, Education, Fine Arts, Land Resources, Language and Literature, Science and Math, Health Sciences, or Social Science.*

*Once an area of interest has been chosen, students will be given further information on courses that pertain to the specific area of interest.*

Each semester students who have enrolled in the GSU Dual Enrollment AA Pathway (Associates of Arts) Program will be advised by the Off-Campus Programs staff.

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- General Electives - *18 Credits* - Credits can be comprised of any courses not required above for general education or area of interest requirements.
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
